Gilead Mishory **Debka Fallastin (Debka Palestine)** For Drabuka and Flute (changing to Piccolo)

The piece was composed in September 2001, and had its worldpremiere at the Theâtre Châtelet, Paris, with Benoit Fromanger, Flute, and the composer at the Drabuka.

The Debka-theme, which is a very popular Arab dance, adopted by the Israeli folklore, became for me one of the signs of optimism and hope for mutual Arab-Jewish life in our country. It appears at the beginning of the piece and is treated as if jazzy-improvised, very rhythmically and positively, till the decline in the middle of page 2. The drabuka solos are normally the imitation of struggle, war-signs, or fate-heaves. During the development the joyous dance-theme is being turned to something like dust, or short, week sobbing. After various scenes of struggle it culminates in a mutual cry-out and protest, and dies at the end, as we all will...
